


Figure 1: The Online Portal login

Fleet Merchant Onboarding in the Valor Portal

1. Login to the Valor Portal

The ISOs must enter their respective credentials on the Valor Portal and the homepage will appear.

When onboarding a new fleet Merchant, go to the "Modules" section in the Valor Portal. Here, you'll find an option to enable fleet transactions.






Figure 3: The Online Portal highlighting the Fleet menu option during Merchant onboarding

3. Viewing fleet Merchants in the Valor Portal

To access fleet Merchant details, navigate to "Settings" and select "Fleet". ISOs can view fleet-related products by exploring the Products, Product Types, and Product Categories sections for each merchant. Simply choose the merchant to see the relevant details.




Figure 4: The Online Portal highlighting the merchant details in Fleet menu



Fleet Transactions in the Valor Portal

This section provides step-by-step instructions for using the fleet transactions in Valor Portal.

1. Login to the Valor Portal

The merchants must enter their respective credentials on the Valor Portal and the homepage will appear.

2. Navigate to the "Fleet" Section

In order to access the fleet option in the Valor Portal, the merchant must navigate to the "Settings" option, followed by "Fleet". Here they can categorize their fleet-related products under the Products, Product Types and Product categories. This helps ensure that each product is correctly classified and makes it easier to retrieve when processing transactions.






Figure 6: The Online Portal highlighting the Product Tab in Fleet Menu

4. Click "Edit" to Change the Product Information




Figure 7: The Online Portal highlighting "edit" option in the vertical ellipses




Figure 8: The Online Portal displaying the product editing option



POS functionalities in Fleet Card

Fleet Card is an exclusive feature available for payments processed via POS terminals. As mentioned earlier, this feature allows the merchants to process fuel-related transactions within the POS terminal. Merchants can effortlessly navigate the VL500 and VL550 POS interface, select fuel types, verify vehicle details, and complete transactions with minimal effort.

Performing fleet transactions with POS terminals

This section elaborates on the process of completing a fuel transaction with the POS terminal.

1. Select Fuel Type

To initiate a fleet card transaction, the user taps the "Fuel" icon on the POS terminal. This action prompts to choose the type of fuel the customer wishes to purchase. The available fuel types depend on the products configured in the Valor Online Portal, so it is important for the user to keep this information updated to ensure accurate pricing and selection.





Figure 10: POS listing the product code



2. Select Product or Service

After selecting the fuel type, the user may need to choose additional products or services based on the customer's request. This could include vehicle maintenance services or in-store items. The user should tap the "Service" or "Store" option and select the appropriate service or product. This can also be done by typing the product code at the search bar.







Figure 11: POS listing the product code Figure 22: Selecting a product in Fleet inventory

3. Enter Transaction Details

Next, the user should enter the transaction details, including product quantities, pricing, and any applicable discounts or promotions. The POS terminal displays a summary of the transaction for review. It is crucial for the user to confirm that all details are accurate before proceeding.








Figure 13: Adding quantity and price of items

4. Vehicle Verification

To complete the transaction, the POS terminal verifies the vehicle's information, such as the odometer reading, Vehicle ID, driver number, and user ID. This verification step helps ensure that the transaction is linked to the correct vehicle and that payment is processed accurately. If there are any discrepancies, the terminal prompts the user for adjustments.








Figure 15: POS terminals verifying Odometer and Vehicle ID






Figure 16: POS terminals verifying details before checkout



5. Complete Payment

After verifying all transaction details, the user proceeds to process the payment. The fleet card is charged for the selected fuel, products, and services, thereby completing the transaction through the POS terminal.
